

**Public Works Meeting
July 17, 2012**

Call to order: Chairman Brad Lambert called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.

Approval of the minutes of June 21, 2012 meeting: Minutes of the March meeting were unanimously approved (moved by Yardy Williams. Second by Larry Fontaine).

Town acceptance of roads in the Lakes Community

Ed Evans reported that his conversations with Nick Bennett, President Lakes Community POA, that the POA is "close" to obtaining the loan and contracting for the necessary paving. Considerable discussion ensued concerning the need to have the paving done prior to October 1, 2012 to allow time for the asphalt to cure before winter. Ed agreed to pass that information to Mr. Bennett. **OPEN**

Blind Road Analysis

After considering all available inputs to the assessment of roads and the limited budget, the committee voted to recommend the paving of Four Diamond from Windy Knob to Tangle Lane (\$27,750), Greencove from Thorncliff to the top of the hill (\$8,355), and Wildwood from Chalet to the end (\$15, 100) to the Town Council for this year's road projects. **CLOSED**

Water Line Analysis

David Poore presented a concept to complete the Snowcloud Drive Waterline Project in 6 incremental sections (five sections of waterline and one repaving of the entire project.) The committee voted to recommend to the Town Council that the Snowcloud Drive Waterline Project be completed as presented. The committee recognizes that the budget is tight in the upcoming years, but feels that the critically of the waterline project dictate that the funds must be found, or created, as soon as possible. **CLOSED**

NEW BUSINESS

Deer Crossing Signs

The increase in our deer population on the mountain, it has been suggested that a "deer crossing" sign could provide a warning to motorists. Since observations indicate that there are many places in Seven Devils where deer cross the roads, it was decided to purchase and install a sign at the bottom of Seven Devils Road with the phrase "Deer Crossing next 3 miles" or similar wording. **CLOSED**

Mirror for Buckeye Lane

In response to a citizen inquiry, Kevin Aldridge will investigate the cost of a road mirror and protective enclosure for the Buckeye Lane location mentioned. It was noted that there used to be a road mirror at that location years ago. **OPEN**
